Grenades attack a conspiracy against country'

ISLAMABAD - Saeed Nausheer Gill Advocate, leader of Pakistan Christian Democracy Party (PCDP), has condemned terrorist attack on the church in Islamabad, calling the inhuman and conspiracy against the country.

Speaking to the mediemen here Tuesday, he said that personification of law undoubtedly had taken in such a horrible and callous manner over the worshippers who were present in the church at the time of attack.

He suggested that such attack revealed that our opponents have played this role only to defence present military government. He said PCDP chief demanded of government to arrest the culprits involved in this gruesome incident and expose them immediately. He added that such attack, which was not on the Christians but his attack was a pre-planned piracy of the enemies of military rule.

He said PCDP, leader Saeed Nausheer, said that the military regime is taking solid steps to eliminate terrorism in collaboration with the law.

He said PCDP chief further said that present rule headed by General Pervez Musharraf, President of Pakistan, is stable and could not be blamed for the failure of the government.
