Stephen C. Denny is a terrorism intelligence professional with over seventeen years of experience in the field of terrorism investigation, intelligence, and consulting. Initially hired by the Federal Bureau of Investigation in 1992, after completing comprehensive training at the FBI Academy, he was assigned as a *Special Agent/ Investigator* with the Terrorism Task Force in the Newark, NJ office. During the eight years assigned to that office, he participated in numerous high-profile investigations (1993 WTC bombing, Unabomber, Murrah Building bombing, etc.). In 2000, he was appointed *Senior Investigator* with the Terrorism Task Force in the New York City office. After the attacks of 9/11/01, his primary focus was the total analysis of the events. In 2002, he was recruited as *Deputy Director* for The Investigative Project, a Washington D.C. based research and consulting "think-tank" focused on terrorism and counter-terrorism initiatives. At The Investigative Project, he served as government liaison to Congressional staffs and committees and conducted numerous interviews on national television and radio, including The O'Reilly Factor, Greta VanSusteren, Lou Dobbs, Geraldo Rivera, National Public Radio, and recently appeared on NBC Nightly News with Brian Williams. After The Investigative Project, he began independent work as a terrorism intelligence and business development consultant for the newly formed I-SAFE Group, New Jersey, and the multi-national corporation EG&G Inc., Arlington, VA, then co-founded The Phronesis Group Inc., NY, NY; a research and analysis effort formed to address the issues raised by the events of 9/11/01 concerning the US intelligence community and the increasingly sophisticated network of terrorists, insurgents, and criminals threatening national security.

After graduating from The Citadel, he served four years in the United States Navy as a commissioned officer, achieving the rank of Lieutenant, JG, prior to joining the FBI. While in the Navy, he served in the Arabian Gulf during the Iran/Iraq War in the late 1980's.

As an FBI terrorism agent, he testified in the trials of those responsible for the first bombing of the World Trade Center and the trial of the "Blind" Sheikh Rahman conspiracy to attack several New York City landmarks in 1994. His ten years of fighting terrorism with the FBI were punctuated when he witnessed the attacks on the World Trade Center on 9/11 from the window of the Federal building in downtown Manhattan. After being called to the scene, he, with fellow agents, narrowly escaped as the south Trade Center tower collapsed.
